

- (iv) Report its findings and recommendations to the Town Council.
- (c) Upon receipt of the Planning Commission's findings and recommendations the Town Council shall either issue the building permit or deny the application for the building permit. Appeal from the action of the Town Council shall be as provided by the laws of the State of Wyoming.

§ 20-1105.

- (a) After a building permit has been issued for the proposed building, no renovations, reconstructions, additions or alterations to the building may be made or utilized without first obtaining a building permit. The term "additions" includes, but it not limited to, any form of object foreign to the construction of the building, its roof, supporting walls, and foundation.

ARTICLE XII

Appeals

§ 20-1201.

- (a) Appeals from the actions of the Council concerning zoning matters may be taken by an aggrieved party to the Board of Adjustment, which shall be established, and which shall proceed in the manner prescribed by Section 15.1-89 Wyoming Statutes, 1957 as amended.

ARTICLE XIII

Penalty

§ 20-1301.

- (a) Section 15.1-83, Wyoming Statutes, 1957, provides that violation of municipal ordinance provisions shall be punishable as misdemeanors, and that the municipality (or any owner of real estate within the District in which the offense occurs) may, in addition to other remedies provided by law, institute injunctions, mandamuses, abatements, or any other appropriate action or proceeding to prevent, enjoin, abate, or remove any unlawful erection, construction, alteration, maintenance or use.

§ 20-1302.

- (a) By authority of said Section 15.1-82, Wyoming Statutes, 1957, any violation of this ordinance shall be deemed a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine not to exceed \$100.00 provided that each continuing day of such violation shall be deemed a separate offense for the purposes of this ordinance, and fines may be levied accordingly.
